

Nicky Raasch Takes SGA Junior Golf Crown

14-Year-Old Wins 7-6 at Tecumseh

Fourteen-year-old Nicky Raasch, who'll be a soph at Jamesville-Dewitt high school in September, played like a veteran as he beat Duane McNett of Marcelus, 7 and 6, in the 36-hole final of the Syracuse Golf Association junior championship tournament at Tecumseh.

The youngest shotmaker to win the colorful classic took a three-up lead during the first nine holes of the morning round but Duane battled back to even terms on the second side to start the afternoon play all even again.

McNett's putter failed him on the 18th as Nicky pulled ahead steadily.

The field includes 29 Juniors under 18 and 15 Boys under 15. The championship proper will be played Aug. 4-5 at Cornell University, Ithaca. Four Juniors and three Boys will be qualified at Onondaga.
